Silent Adoration

From a letter of Father Pio from Pietrelcina (Epistolary I)

My dearest father,

I should like to open up my chest for a moment to show you the wound which our tender Jesus has lovingly opened in this heart of mine! My heart has found at last a Lover so fond of it that it is incapable of upsetting Him anymore.

You already know this Lover. He is a lover who never gets angry with those who offend Him. My heart holds within itself an infinite number of His mercies. It knows that it doesn't have anything of value with which to glorify itself before Him. He has loved me and given me a special place among many other creatures.

When I ask him what I have done to deserve so much consolation, he smiles at me and answers that nothing is denied to an intercessor. He only asks me for love as a reward; but don't I owe this to him out of gratitude?

Oh my father, if only I could please him slightly in the same way that He pleases me! He is so much in love with my heart that He makes me burn with His divine fire, with the fire of His love. What is this fire that pervades my whole being? Dear Father, if Jesus makes us so happy on earth, what will heaven be like?

I sometimes wonder if there are souls who do not feel their breast burning with this divine fire, especially when they are before Him in the sacrament. This seems to me impossible, especially if it concerns a priest, a religious man. Perhaps those souls who say they do not feel this fire, do not feel it because of their larger heart. Only with this benign interpretation can I be associated with them, so as not to blame them of being liars.

Silent Adoration

Visit to the Most Blessed Sacrament, by Saint Alphonsus Maria de' Liguori

My Lord Jesus Christ, Who, for the love which Thou bearest to men, remainest night and day in this Sacrament full of compassion and of love, awaiting, calling, and welcoming all who come to visit Thee; I believe that Thou art present in the Sacrament of the Altar; I adore Thee from the abyss of my nothingness, and I thank Thee for all the graces which Thou hast bestowed upon me, and in particular for having given me Thyself in this Sacrament, for having given me Thy most holy Mother Mary for my advocate, and for having called me to visit Thee in this church. I now salute Thy most loving Heart; and this for three ends: first in thanksgiving for this great gift. Second to make amends to Thee for all the outrages which Thou receivest in this Sacrament from all Thine enemies. Third I intend by this visit to adore Thee in all the places on earth in which Thou art present in this Sacrament, and in which Thou art the least revered and the most abandoned. My Jesus, I love Thee with my whole heart. I grieve for having hitherto so many times offended Thine infinite goodness. I purpose by Thy grace never more to offend Thee for the time to come; and now, miserable and unworthy though I be, I consecrate myself to Thee without reserve; I give Thee and renounce my entire will, my affections, my desires, and all that I possess. From henceforward do Thou dispose of me and of all that I have as Thou pleasest. All that I ask of Thee and desire is Thy holy love, final perseverance, and the perfect accomplishment of Thy will. I recommend to Thee the Souls in Purgatory; but especially

those who had the greatest devotion to the Most Blessed Sacrament and to the Most Blessed Virgin Mary. I also recommend to Thee all poor sinners. Finally, my dear Saviour, I unite all my affections with the affections of Thy most loving Heart; and I offer them, thus united, to Thy Eternal Father, and beseech Him in Thy name to vouchsafe, for Thy love, to accept and grant them.

From the Gospel according to John (17,1a; 6-11; 15-19)

The topic for our future reflections

Like every year, our General Director, Father Franco Moscone, will introduce to us the topic that will inspire our reflections in our catechesis meetings. Let us listen together to his words of presentation for the pastoral year 2020-2021.

Dear brothers and sisters of Padre Pio's Prayer Groups,

Let us begin a new pastoral year, the third of a cyclical journey on the spirituality of Padre Pio. Our starting point for the first year (2018-2019) was his pressing invitation: "sanctify yourself and sanctify your neighbour". We then continued our journey in the second year (2019-2020), through meditation on the work of the Holy Spirit and the Christian virtues: "the operations of the Holy Spirit". We thus reached the third year 2020-2021 which is marked by the theme: "... you must thirst for the health of your brothers and sisters".

This sentence was taken from a letter that Padre Pio wrote to one of his first spiritual daughters, Margherita Tresca, in 1919. Orinary from Barletta, in Puglia, she lived a long period of suffering and isolation, due to the obstacles put in her way by her family who were against her desire to consecrate herself to the Lord in religious life. In January 1919 she was admitted to the Roman novitiate of the Brigidine Sisters, the order of the Most Holy Saviour and St. Bridget, where Sister Pia, Padre Pio's own sister, had also entered a few years before. The commitment to conform to the new life and the movement of inner purification, which the Lord was carrying out in her, drove her to love impetuses very similar to those of her spiritual father: she wanted to detach herself from everything and unite herself definitively with Jesus, the heavenly Bridegroom. Padre Pio tried to mitigate her desire, making it more in line with her chosen vocational reality, and accompanies his spiritual daughter on the path of a total self-offering to God: "Your mission is not fulfilled yet and rather than being absorbed in God, you must thirst for the health of your brothers". Although the letter is now more than a hundred years old, Padre Pio's invitation and the context in which he writes these words are fully relevant and useful to today's spiritual life. As believers, and also as Prayer Groups, we often speak of missionary commitment, but we run the risk of stopping at low-cost initiatives that involve little of our personal history. In Margherita Tresca's time as well as in ours, the mission always begins from the depths of our heart, when we concretely experience the difficulty and loneliness of the journey: it is then that we fully share the thirst for Christ, and make the Lord's cry on the Cross our own: I am thirsty (Jn 19:28). Only by sharing His thirst do we empty ourselves of ourselves, and make the same sentiments that Christ Jesus felt as if they were our own' (Phil 2:5ff). By feeling this thirst we will be able to understand Padre Pio's advice to his spiritual daughter in depth: "to thirst for the health of our brothers" ... and we will feel this advice addressed today to each one of us, who receive motivation and help to live our faith in the Church to the full from Padre Pio himself.

Missionary prayer

Blessed be God, who called us to a holy vocation, and with Him we exalt his Divine Son who by his death has opened the doors of heaven to us, and the Holy Spirit who daily makes us his messengers of hope and peace.

Send your spirit, Lord, to renew the earth.

L. I am the vine and you are the branches.

Stay with us, Lord, that our thoughts may be your thoughts and our words may be your words.

L. Only one thing you lack if you want to be perfect, go and sell all your possessions and give them to the poor, then come and follow me.

Give us the grace to know how we can follow you with Franciscan joy and full availability, in the footsteps of Saint Pio of Pietrelcina, to be missionaries with our life and our heart.

L. He who welcomes you, welcomes me, he who welcomes me, welcomes the one who sent me.
